# REGISTRATION OF FOREIGN CITIZENS IN THE ELECTORAL CENSUS







## Who?

Below citizens have the right to register in the electoral census:

- a) If over 17 years old;
- b) Nationals of the following countries:
  - 1) Member States of the European Union;
  - 2) Brazil and Cape Verde;
  - 3) Argentina, Chile, Colombia, Iceland, Norway, New Zealand, Peru, United Kingdom, Uruguay and Venezuela.
- **a)** <u>Law No. 13/99, of March 22</u>, with subsequent amendments (<u>Legal Regime for Electoral Census</u>)
- b) Statement No. 29/2021, of March 25







## **Conditions**

Legal residents in Portugal:

- a) Nationals of **Member State of the European Union** with Registration Certificate or Certificate of Permanent Residence for Citizen of the European Union;
- b) Nationals of Brazil (without the status of equal political rights) and Cape Verde, with a valid residence permit in Portugal for more than two years;
- c) Nationals of Argentina, Chile, Colombia, Iceland, Norway, New Zealand, Peru, United Kingdom, Uruguay and Venezuela, with a valid residence permit, in Portugal, for more than three years.







## Where and when? Where?

In the census committee of the Parish Council corresponding to the domicile indicated on the residence permit.

#### When?

- **a)** At all times, up to the 61st day prior to any election (voter registration is suspended on the 60th day prior to the election in question).
- **b)** Whenever the registered person changes the address on the residence permit, he/she must carry out the census at the Parish Council of the new address or, if it is the same Parish Council, update the address.







## Residence documentation to present

- a) Nationals of **Member State of the European Union**: Registration Certificate or Certificate of Permanent Residence for Citizens of the European Union;
- **b)** Nationals of **Brazil** and **Cape Verde**, with a valid residence permit in Portugal **for more than two years**;
- c) Nationals of Argentina, Chile, Colombia, Iceland, Norway, New Zealand, Peru, United Kingdom, Uruguay and Venezuela, with a valid residence permit, in Portugal, for more than three years;
- **d) Others** documents for filling in the information from the Electoral Census Information and Management System (SIGRE).







Brazilian citizens with the status of equal political rights and who have voluntarily obtained a citizen card are automatically registered in the electoral constituency corresponding to the address on the citizen card.
